Kobe & Kaluna

The generous donations from our supporters give a running start and a new lease on life to dogs like Kobe and Kaluna. Kobe arrived at Auburn Valley Humane Society in May 2019 and extremely emaciated. He weighed a mere 30 lbs., which is devastatingly thin for

a 5-year old Pit Bull Terrier Mix who should weigh approximately

65 lbs. Though his body was weak, with signs of extreme malnourishment and open wounds, Kobe greeted everyone here at the shelter with big, slobbery kisses. The animal care technicians, volunteer dog walkers, veterinary staff, and his foster family, worked tirelessly to rehabilitate Kobe's broken body so it could match his sweet spirit. By the



time Kobe was adopted in June 2019, he weighed a whopping 53 lbs and was steadily gaining more weight.

AVHS could only assume what Kobe's life looked like before he arrived at AVHS. They just knew he deserved the best care we had to give. So many pets like Kobe and Kaluna come through AVHS' doors; deserving of the compassionate care they need to start new lives and leave our shelter with a forever home. Kobe

gradually gained weight and trust in his new owners. Then they brought Kobe back to AVHS shelter to meet with Kaluna. Kobe now has a furr sister, Kaluna and they go for long walks, romps in the park, and roll in the dirt in the backyard together. Kaluna puts her paw on Kobe and won't let him up. Kaluna and Kobe are very loyal to their people and very happy dogs.

Now that fall is

approaching, we at AVHS look back at a busy 2019. To start, the Board of Directors has grown by three new members! The Gala and Barkfest, were both a huge success and the Pets Without Me program has kicked off. The Thrift Store had its fifth anniversary and a five year lease extension has been signed.

Our seven year agreement for housing the City of Auburns lost pets, ending in December of this year, and has also been extended for an additional seven years. Pet Licensing numbers have significantly increased over last year and animal intake, owner reclaims and adoptions have increased as well.

At the half way point of 2018, AVHS is on track to meet and exceed all the budgetary expectations set by the Board of Directors for this year. Most importantly, our live release rate for animals in our care has maintained at 98% + and our length of stay for cats is trending at 9 days and for dogs is trending at 4 days.

While this all may seem like business as usual at AVHS, it could not have happened without the efforts of our dedicated staff, the guidance and direction of our Board of Directors and the triumphs of this past year could not have happened without our loyal and hardworking volunteers. We have a great team here at the Auburn Valley Humane Society and as I look to the end of this year, I am very proud to be a part of it.

Thank you all again for all you do and helping us change lives... four paws at a time!

October is Pet License Amnesty Month!

Late fees are waived in October only!

Did you know? All dogs and cats residing in the city limits of Auburn require a pet license. Licensing your pet provides yet another layer of protection in the event that your pet goes missing. Each pet is given a 5 digit tag number that is unique and associated to them only. Purchasing a pet license will not only quickly reunite a pet with its owner, but funds received from licensing directly benefit the lost and homeless animals in the City's care and continue the Auburn Valley Humane Society's mission of enriching the lives of companion animals through animal sheltering, programs, and community engagement. Failure to obtain a pet license in the City of Auburn results in a civil infraction with a monetary fine of \$50.
