

I hope this newsletter finds you, your loved ones and your faithful furry friends happy and healthy. 2020 has been an interesting year - one that none of us could have predicted. A year that started with great promise but has seen us through many moments of uncertainty and unrest. So much has changed since my last letter to you. With all this going on in the world around us, the animals

didn't seem to take note. Kittens and puppies were still being born, lost dogs and cats were still entering the shelter, and pet owners were still in need of resources to rehome their pets. While there was less staff and very few volunteers, our responsibility to care for these pets did not change. As the wet days of spring transitioned into the long warm days of summer, and now into days of falling leaves and crisp winds, there are still kennels to clean, dogs to walk, cats to socialize and many, many mouths to feed. Our personal pets seemed unaffected through these world changes. In fact, some of our pets appreciated and got used to the extra time we were able to spend with them at home. I know during the past year my furry, feathered, and scaly friends whom I share my daily life with have eased the discomfort of separation, loneliness, and confusion I have felt.

Because of social distance and occupancy requirements, our staff was reduced and many of our volunteers could not come in and spend time with the animals in our care. The

importance of volunteers became very evident when we did not have the capacity to care for as many animals as in pre-pandemic times. More importantly, the staff and I missed the volunteers! Their dedication and smiling faces inspire us on a daily basis to continue the difficult work of saving lives. Some volunteers were able to do projects for us at home, and many had the opportunity to foster animals in need. We are hopeful that soon it will be safe to lift these restrictions and allow life to be back to the way we remembered it.

Auburn Valley Humane Society has persevered, stayed focused and continued the mission of helping animals and people in need. One of the bright spots that stands out over the past nine months during this numbing haze was adoption number 10,000. This event, as little as it may seem in the big picture with all that is going on, was a milestone for our young organization. The fact that we surpassed ten thousand adoptions during these dark times is a testament to our strong will and determination to match lifelong and loving families to the homeless animals in our care. This, and the other triumphs of this year, could not have happened without the efforts of our dedicated staff, the guidance of our Board of Directors, and the loyalty of our hardworking volunteers. I am proud to be part of the great team at Auburn Valley Humane Society. It is my sincere hope that when I write the next newsletter in the spring, the light at the end of this tunnel will be much brighter and we will be more confident and a lot less uncertain about our future in the world and the future of the animals in the community we care about.

Please stay safe, and **THANK YOU** for your continued support and being an important part of helping us changing lives... four paws at a time!

Meet Stitch!

AVHS does not know much about Stitch's past, but we hope that he can help shape the future for how we help our community and make a difference. Stitch was found by a good Samaritan and they brought him to AVHS with the hopes of locating his owners. Stitch came in happy as can be, and

the word "stranger" was NOT in his vocabulary. Everyone he meets is his new best friend! Stitch had a nice new harness on when he arrived, quickly wiggling his way into everyone's heart.

Shortly after his arrival, our medical team found open wounds underneath his new harness. The vet indicated that Stitch must have been wearing a smaller, different harness, too small for his body frame. It had caused horrific deep wounds over his neck, chest, and armpits.

Stitch is a FAST growing puppy, and there is no way to know how long or how short of a time this took to happen. What we do know is that he was obviously cared for and loved previously. He shows it in his personality, and someone bought him that new harness to help him heal. What we do not know is how he ended up at the shelter and why? Was his family too embarrassed to ask for assistance? Could they not afford

medical care? Did they get overwhelmed and not know what to do? Times can be challenging, especially right now.

Whatever the reason, AVHS will help you, coach you, and provide resources to everyone! Please reach out to AVHS if you need help. We are here to listen, and we are here to help in the best way we can. We are not perfect and may not always have the solution right away, but we can steer you in the right direction and identify potential solutions.

We hope we see fewer animals coming to the shelter like Stitch and more animals getting the help that they need so they do not end up in a similar situation.

As for Stitch, don't worry about him! He wiggled his way into everyone's heart, and he is already adopted by someone who will spoil him rotten for the rest of his days.

We need your help in caring for animals like Stitch and supporting animal welfare in our communities. COVID-19 has taught us many things, and teaming together to provide compassionate care and support is more critical now than ever. 

October is Pet License Amnesty Month!



Late fees are waived in October only!

Did you know? All dogs and cats residing in the city limits of Auburn require a pet license. Licensing your pet provides yet another layer of protection in the event that your pet goes missing. Each pet is given a 5 digit tag number that is unique and associated to them only. Purchasing a pet license will not only quickly reunite a pet with its owner, but funds received from licensing directly benefits the lost and homeless animals in the City's care and continues the Auburn Valley Humane Society's mission of enriching the lives of companion animals through animal sheltering, programs, and community engagement. Failure to obtain a pet license in the City of Auburn results in a civil infraction with a monetary fine of \$50. Pet licensing locations:
