Looking back at the past two years of the pandemic, we have all become a little more resilient and pivoted our lifestyles to what has become the new normal. With the impact on public health, the tragic loss of some of our closest friends, employment, food, and housing insecurity, there are no words to describe the heavy

toll these past two years have taken. Our hearts and continued support go out to all our two and four-legged friends affected during these tumultuous times.

While these times have been some of the most challenging of any I can remember in my 60 years, it has also been a time of growth and change for Auburn Valley Humane Society. Because of the limitations the pandemic has created for our organization, intake mitigation and providing more social services to the public have prevailed. Pivoting our efforts to low-cost spay and neuter services and public assistance programs has become a natural path. The merger of Auburn Valley Humane Society and Northwest Spay & Neuter Center a year ago has proven to be a huge success. Providing over 13,800 surgeries in 2021, Northwest Spay & Neuter Center is the largest spay and neuter clinic in Washington State. Over the past year, we have worked diligently to expand our programs, strengthen our partnerships, and do our best to provide the most outstanding possible care for those who need it in our region.

The one thing that hasn't changed over the past year is the support from our community. We need your support more now

than ever and sincerely appreciate your continued assistance to provide the best possible care to the pets and their owners in our community. Auburn Valley Humane Society launched a low-cost wellness clinic at Northwest Spay & Neuter Center for income-qualified residents and their pets this past February. We initially wondered if there would be a need for these services. After a month of seeing 32 appointments a day, four days a week (booked out three weeks in advance), that question has been answered. Our next project will expand on this success to assist even more pets in need.

Today, I ask you to think of the lives of animals and their owners that Auburn Valley Humane Society and Northwest Spay & Neuter Center cares for daily. Without your support, achieving our mission would not be possible. Every day Auburn Valley Humane Society and Northwest Spay & Neuter Center strive to be models of excellence in the advancement of animal welfare. Our goal is to enrich the lives of companion animals and the people through animal sheltering, programs, and community engagement.

As we Spring into 2022, and our lives continue to adjust to the new normal, our dedication and concern for the advocacy of our pawsome friends have not changed. In my last few letters to you, I hoped there would be light at the end of the tunnel for everyone sooner than later. Now, as the pandemic is loosening its hold on how we live in our world, that light is becoming stronger, and as we get closer, we continue to persevere now more than ever before.

#### **Meet Jaws!**

A stray cat was rescued by a good samaritan and brought to the AVHS animal shelter.

The cat displayed facial and jaw trauma. Our awesome vet staff gave the cat fluids and medications to stablilize it. Performing an x-ray showed a fractured jaw in two places. The staff researched and discussed the case with a dental specialist from Norway! The AVHS staff veterinarian performed

an external stabilization procedure called the "button technique." The buttons are placed at three points on the face and secured with strong suture. This keeps the upper and lower jaw still and immobile (much like a cast on a broken limb). A small gap was left between the upper and lower jaw so that the cat could still eat by licking up soft food. A special feeding tube was inserted in case the cat decided not to eat on its own.

The buttons stayed in place for six weeks. The cat was able to eat by himself while in a foster home. The cat was seen weekly by the vet to ensure the proper healing. By performing another x-ray, the fractures had healed and the buttons were able to be removed. He had a final check-up and he looked like a normal cat. He was adopted in mid-November. We

are lucky that Jaws arrived at Auburn Valley Humane Society. He was able to get the care that he so desperately needed, but there are so many others like him. This extraordinary care was made possible by donors like you. Your support is critical to helping animals like Jaws take the steps to a second chance.

AVHS offers programs and resources to support animals and people in our community, including low-cost preventative care, spay and neuter surgeries, and training your pet. If you need resources, check out our website.

# **April is Pet License Amnesty Month!**



#### Late fees are waived in April only!

require a pet license. Licensing your pet provides yet another layer of protection in the event that your pet goes missing. Each pet is given a 5 digit tag number that is unique and associated to them only. Purchasing a pet license will not only quickly reunite a pet with its owner, but funds received from licensing directly benefit the lost and homeless animals in the City's care and continue the Auburn Valley Humane Society's mission of enriching the lives of companion animals through animal sheltering, programs, and community engagement. Failure to obtain a pet license in the City of Auburn results in a civil infraction with a monetary fine of \$50. Pet licensing locations:

# Wellness Clinic Opens

In February, we opened our non-profit wellness clinic to ensure all pet owners have access to low-cost preventative care like affordable spay & neuter, vaccinations, and parasite prevention. Our clinic is staffed by licensed veterinarians and registered veterinary support staff with services offered to households qualified by income. We are not a full-service veterinary clinic and do not treat sick or injured pets. We will be operating the clinic 4 days a week serving 100 families.

NW Spay & Neuter provides affordable spay/neuter services for cats and dogs in an effort to prevent overpopulation and maintain healthy pets. We are providing services 5 days a week serving over 325 animals.

Go online to make an e-appointment for a cat or dog spay or neuter or for a wellness appointment.

Vaccinations and other services are offered at the time of surgery, including microchipping, flea treatment, toenail trim, and many other services.

Over 13,000 cats and dogs are altered each year for the income qualified and the partner shelters and rescues.
